


Survey - Identify Watershed Natural Assets

What is the purpose of this survey?

The EIWD is in the process of renewing the Integrated Watershed Management Plan for the Netley-Grassmere-Willow Creek Watersheds (map on page 3). We will be working with governments, professionals, and watershed residents to help prioritize and develop ways to protect, restore and manage the Watershed Natural Assets.

What is a Watershed?

A watershed is a topographically defined area of land where all of the precipitation that lands within it flows either downwards into the soil to become groundwater, or across the landscape through waterways to a common downstream point.




Watershed Example

What are Watershed Natural Assets?

Watershed Natural Assets are things and places in the watershed that are environmentally, socially and economically important. These can be biological assets (rare birds, fish, bugs, plants), land and water areas (specific rivers, lakes, wetlands, grasslands, forests), or the soil and air in the watershed.

What are Risks to Watershed Natural Assets?

Risks can be any activity that reduces the size, functionality, or sustainability of a natural asset. Examples include pollution, urban development, deforestation, and climate change.



Risks to a Natural Asset. In this example, the surface water in a specific stream is the natural asset and the risks are point and nonpoint sources of pollutants.


